Why DSS?

What doesn't DSS do?

DSS does not offer tutoring, mental health counseling, financial assistance, personal care attendants, or mobility equipment. All of those personal i tems are available through other resources. Who decides if a person has a disability?

The student, the DSS Director or Coordinator, and information from the diagnostician help to determine if the student has a disability that will result in difficulty accessing facilities and/or academic programs. Disabilities include Traumatic Brain Injuries, Deaf and Hard of Hearing, Blind and Low Vision, Post Traumatic Stress Disorder, Attention Deficit Disorder, learning disabi lities, PHQWDOLOOQHVV PRELOLW\ DQG RWKHU
