## V. DISCUSSION/ACTIONITEMS

A. Campus Policy on Copyright/Compliance with TEACH Act Guest: Sue BalteReitz, Interim Director of eLearning

Dr. BalterReitz stated that one of her first tasks as Interim Director was working with the Library and eReserves, as well as the **TEA**Act (Technology, Education, and Copyright Harmonization Act of 2002). The TEACH Act protects Universities, so long as we meet three criteria: (1) must be a proofit, (2) must have a copyright policy, and (3) must have eduational materials available faculty regarding copyright. Dr. Balter Reitz began researching policies and found a very fatoutlysed one at Duke University. After receiving permission to use it, this is the policy before the Senate today. It essentially gives guidelines and directs faculty resources. The policy will be voted on at the next meeting.
