The minutes of December accepted as presented.

I. ASSESSMENT UPDATÆICE PROVOST REPORT

Dr. Barron reported that, in December, the Executive Committee of the Academic Senate urged the GEC chairs to meet with Vice Provost Matt Redinger and Registeri Johannes to figure out how to encourage students to take the ETS test in the Spring semester. The Admissions Office already sends letters to students in January, if they will be seniors the following Fall, advising them about applying for gradium and other concerns. This is around 700 students this year. The idea is the GEC sentan additional letter to these students, informing them they will be required to take the ETS test before they will be allowed to register for Fall 2018 (registerities March 1.9). This is known as a registration hold. However, students will not be told that this is a fake hold. No students will actually be held from registration. Dr. Barron and Ms. Tilton put together a letter to faculty and deans, urging of the encourage students to get the testing done. Students will be able to take the test online, unproctored, at no cost.
