It was noted that the UCC is seeing this new program since the master's also includes an undergraduate 3+2 option. Clinton Culp, Health & Human Performance, noted that students will actually earn both a BS in Outdoor Adventure Leadership and an MS in Adventure Leadership in Health and Recreation. They hope to have 10 students in the first cohort, which will help fund the hiring of a half-time instructor who will need to be a certified recreation specialist. Almost the whole program is taught face-to-face.

The question was raised whether the program will be able to handle nine students going into one option while one single student goes into the other option, if there will be enough courses offered for that one student. Dr. Culp stated that they will need to consider that possibility, and perhaps substitute some courses. Dr. Culp also noted that students who start the 3+2 program and then decide not to finish the masters can still earn a BS in Outdoor Adventure Leadership.
